■ Kenrokuen Garden, Kanazawa City, Ishikawa Prefecture

A Japanese garden located in Kanazawa City, Ishikawa Prefecture, Kenrokuen was originally a domain garden built in the middle of the 17th century by the Kaga Clan on the outer grounds of Kanazawa Castle.

It is one of the three most famous gardens in Japan, along with Kairakuen Garden in Mito and Korakuen Garden in Okayama.

In 2009, it was awarded the highest rating of three stars in the Michelin Tourism Guide.

■ Ishikawa Prefecture/Kanazawa City, Higashi Chaya-gai

This sightseeing spot flourished as a teahouse district officially recognized by the Kaga clan and was selected as a national Important Preservation District for Groups of Traditional Buildings. The old streets remain as they were in the olden days, and the old machiya houses are characterized by their protruding latticework, called "kimusuko.

Visitors can hear the sounds of shamisen and drums, and experience the elegant Japanese culture.

■ Ishikawa Prefecture/Kanazawa City, Omimachi Market

The market is popularly known as "Kanazawa's kitchen. Mainly fresh food and other food products. The market has supported Kanazawa's food culture for more than 300 years since the Edo period. Kaisendon, a bowl of rice topped with seafood, is very popular among tourists.

■ Kanazawa Castle Park, Kanazawa City, Ishikawa Prefecture

The castle of the Maeda family of Kaga Hyakumangoku. The Ishikawa Gate, the 30-ken row house, and the Tsurumaru warehouse are designated as Important Cultural Properties.

The Hishi Yagura (water chestnut turret), the 50-ken row houses, and the Hashizume-mon continuation turret give visitors a sense of Kaga's history and culture.

■ Kanazawa Castle Park, Kanazawa City, Ishikawa Prefecture

The castle of the Maeda family of Kaga Hyakumangoku. The Ishikawa Gate, the 30-ken row house, and the Tsurumaru warehouse are designated as Important Cultural Properties.

The Hishi Yagura, the 50-ken row houses, and the Hashizume-mon continuation turret give visitors a sense of Kaga's history and culture.

■ Komatsu City, Ishikawa Prefecture , Nayadera Temple

In Kaga, there has long been a belief in Hakusan, or Mt. Hakusan, and worship of the gods of nature. The rocky cave on the temple grounds is a sacred place where souls are revived and purified.

■ Fukui Prefecture/Sakai City/Tojinbo

The most distinctive feature of Tojinbo is its impressive cliffs, which have been designated as a national natural monument. Pyroxene andesite is a strange columnar rock.

You can enjoy a great panorama from Tojinbo Tower.

You can also enjoy a cruise on a sightseeing boat.

■ Fukui Prefecture/Sakai City/Echizen Matsushima Aquarium

The daily penguin walks are very popular!

You can interact with dolphins and seals, and experience feeding sea turtles and tortoises.
